

#### **Attendance**

It is important for all students to be in school everyday and on time. Students miss out on learning when they are not here. The school will contact families of absent students who have not called the office. Upon excessive unexcused tardies or absences, a warning letter may be sent regardless of the reason for the absences. After additional occurrences of unexcused absences, a referral may be sent to the Attorney General's Office for mediation.

<u>CGMS Tardy Policy</u>: If a student is tardy to the same class three times a disciplinary referral will be given to the student, resulting in an After School Detention. If a student is habitually tardy to the class over the three times, more severe consequences will be given and/or a guardian meeting will be held.

# **Grading System**

Grades show how well students are doing in school. They can point out areas where students need to improve. Every nine weeks, students receive a grade in each subject. Semester/final grades are based on the average of two nine-week periods. Final grades for a semester course are based on the average of the two quarters.

This is the grading system used by our teachers:


A = Excellent 90% - 100% B = Above Average 80% - 89% C = Average 70% - 79% D = Below Average 60% - 69% F = Failing 50% - 59%

## **Student Expectations**

Casa Grande Middle School utilizes PBIS (Positive Behaviors, Interventions & Supports). By doing this, school safety is improved and positive behavior is promoted. The focus is on prevention not punishment, as positive behaviors are taught to all students.

The five expectations of CGMS Students are: Patience, Respect, Integrity, Dependability & Excellence.

In the matrix below, all five expectations are listed with positive behaviors in each area of Casa Grande Middle School. All students are taught and expected to exhibit all of these positive behaviors.



#### PBIS at CGMS

When students are seen showing any of the five expectations (Patience, Respect, Integrity, Dependability, & Excellence), any CGMS staff member can give a student a PBIS Ticket.

These tickets are used for drawings, raffles and at our PBIS Store. The PBIS Store is held monthly at CGMS where students can use their tickets to purchase supplies, snacks, or any items that are "for sale".

### **Cell Phone Policy**

- Cell phones are to be silent and in the student's backpack during school hours.
- Cell phones being used will be confiscated by staff and placed in the front office. Parents will be required to pick it up from the CGMS office.
- Repetitive violations of the cell phone policy may result in other disciplinary actions.
- CGMS is not responsible for the loss, damage, or theft of cell phones.
- Students in possession of cell phones with offensive or inappropriate photos or texts may be subject to disciplinary action and criminal charges.
- School board policy allows school officials to search students' personal property, including cell phones, when there is reason to believe that the search will produce evidence of a violation of the law or school rules.

### **Dress Code Policy**

- Each student is required to possess a student ID while on campus.
- Obscene language or symbols of drugs, sex, or alcohol on clothing are prohibited.
- Gang-affiliated personalization is neither permitted on clothing nor on one's person.
- Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times.
- All shirts must cover the midriff (stomach).
- Pants are to be worn at the waist. No sagging. Belts are encouraged.
- Students are to think before leaving their house. Evaluate whether anything is exposed.

# <u>School Updates</u>

Email messages and social media posts are sent out periodically to notify families and students of important information, upcoming events, etc. for CGMS. Please contact the school if you would like to sign up for email messages and follow CGMS on Facebook, Twitter or Instagram.

If there is an emergency situation on campus, CGMS will send an email notification ASAP, and verbally contact families, if necessary.

In order to ensure that we can communicate with families promptly and effectively, please refrain from calling or visiting the CGMS office, unless contacted first.

## Food/Drink Policy

All food and drinks brought on campus must be stored in backpacks. Consumption of food/drinks will be allowed only during breakfast, lunch or during a time when the teacher deems appropriate. All drinks must be able to be "closed" with a cap so they may be stored in backpacks. Students should not bring fountain drinks, coffee drinks, energy drinks, or gum onto campus in the mornings. DoorDash and food deliveries will NOT be accepted for students.

### <u>Nurse</u>

When a student becomes ill or injured, they can get permission to go to the nurse's office. Students must not leave school for any reason without the permission of the nurse, principal or being signed out by a parent or guardian. Students are not allowed to use personal cell phones or classroom phones to call their parents to inform them that they are sick and/or to pick them up. The student must go through the Nurse's office and it will be at the Nurse's discretion to contact a parent for the student's release.

WHEN MEDICATION IS BROUGHT TO THE SCHOOL BY A STUDENT OR PARENT, IT MUST BE TAKEN DIRECTLY TO THE NURSE'S OFFICE. THE NURSE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR GIVING OUT MEDICATION AT SCHOOL BUT CAN ONLY DO SO WITH THE WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM THE STUDENT'S GUARDIAN.

The state of Arizona requires that sometime during the year, all 6th grade students and many other students will receive hearing and vision screenings. Any parent that does not want their child screened must submit a written letter to the nurse.

### **Promotion**

It is our goal to work with all 8th grade students and families so that they have the information and support necessary for them to meet the following criteria for their participation in our promotion ceremony:

- 10+ unexcused absences during the 2022-2023 school year
- Students must be in good behavioral standing at school.
  - No suspensions 4th Quarter
  - No outstanding or unserved ASDs or Friday Schools
- Students must have a passing semester grade in each of their classes.
- Student's school account must have a balance of \$0.

More information is provided to 8th Grade students and families throughout the year.

### **Extra-Curricular Activities**

There are a wide variety of activities offered to students after school. Student athletes and club members are expected to meet certain academic and behavior criteria. The requirements for each activity will be explained by the activity sponsor.

#### Sports:

- If a student becomes ineligible, they will not be allowed to participate in or attend any practices/events and must sit out at least one game. Once the student is eligible, they will be reinstated.
- Attendance is vital to practices. Should a student not attend scheduled practices, the student can be removed from the team.
- Should the student display any inappropriate behaviors during practices or games, the student may be removed from the team.
- Proper care of uniforms and all sports equipment is expected of all student athletes.

## **After School Sports/Events**

Students must be academically and behaviorally eligible to attend any school sporting or extra-curricular events. Any student attending a sporting or extra-curricular activity must be accompanied by an adult. Students are expected to stay at the game location and behave in accordance with all CGMS expectations. It is also expected that all students exhibit good sportsmanship towards the visiting teams.

## Forbidden Items

The safest place for personal items is at home. These items are, but are not limited to: **balloons**, **gum**, **laser pointers**, **cameras**, **mouthwash**, **candy**, **water guns**, **pistols**, **roller-blades**, **roller skates**, **snap caps**, **stink bombs**, **any item designed to create an electrical shock**, **eggs**, **rubber bands**, **golf balls**, **baseballs**, **softballs**, **racquet**, **tennis and super balls**, **glass items**, **glue**, **shaving cream**, **nail polish**, **paint**, **correction fluid**, **toys**, **aerosol/pump sprays**, **scissors**, **bandanas**, **permanent markers (except classroom approved highlighters)**, **seeds**, **stuffed animals**, **flowers**, **Bluetooth speakers**, **any device or item related to vaping or smoking**, **and money or items not needed for school**.

Selling, borrowing, gambling, lending money or personal items on campus is also forbidden.

#### DRUGS AND ALCOHOL

Drugs and alcohol are not allowed on campus. This includes any ecigarettes, tobacco products, vapes (THC or nicotine) or drug related paraphernalia. Any student involved in a drug or alcohol related offense will be subject to disciplinary action, with a possible referral to a district hearing.

#### Student Search

To ensure the school is safe for all students, sometimes it is necessary for a school administrator to search students and their personal belongings. There is no expectation of privacy in your locker or personal items. Families will only be notified if illegal items are found. We have a need, by law, to do searches whenever there is reasonable suspicion that a student may have broken school rules or the law. A student may be searched by having the student empty his/her pockets, socks, purse, or backpack. At least two adults will be present during this search.

# <u>Discipline</u>

#### **Due Process**

All students will receive due process which includes being told what they are being accused of and having the chance to say what happened from their own point of view.

#### **Community Service**

Community Service is held during lunch and/or after school Monday-Thursday from 4-5:30pm. Students must attend Community Service the day/s it is assigned. If there is a conflict on the day/s assigned, the assigning administrator is the only person who can authorize the change of date/s. Community Service takes precedence over all activities, including sports.

#### After School Detention

After School Detention is held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4-5:30pm. Students must attend After School Detention the day it is assigned. If there is a conflict on the day ASD is assigned, the assigning administrator is the only person who can authorize the change of date of the detention. ASD takes precedence over all activities, including sports. If a student is absent the entire day the ASD is assigned, the ASD will be reassigned for a subsequent school day in which the student is present at school.

#### Friday School

Friday School is held on Fridays from 8:30-10:30am. Students must attend the day it is assigned. If there is a conflict on the day assigned, the assigning administrator is the only person who can authorize the date change. Families are responsible for providing transportation for student to and from Friday School.

#### Suspension

If a student is suspended, they are not allowed on CGMS campus or grounds for the duration of their suspension. Suspensions can be up to ten days, unless a district disciplinary hearing is held, where students may be referred for a long-term suspension or expulsion.

#### <u>Student Concerns, Complaints &</u> <u>Grievances</u>

In accordance with Governing Board Policy JII, the Casa Grande Elementary School District has established procedures for addressing occurrences of bullying, harassment, and intimidation. Students who feel they are the victim of harassment, bullying, or intimidation, have the right to anonymously provide a report to school officials. Within 30 calendar days of a complaint, a report must be made to a school administrator or professional staff member. All reports of allegations will be documented and investigated by school administration.

## Fees/Fines

Students who owe money cannot participate in extra-curricular activities, get a final report card or promotion certificate. Students may owe for things such as lost books, library fines, athletic equipment, technology, or supply replacement.

## **Technology**

Students check out a laptop at the beginning of the school year. When using the laptop, students are expected to:

- Bring any laptop malfunctions or problems to IT or one of their teachers
- Make good choices while online and adhere to to Acceptable Use Agreement signed at the beginning of the year
- Take care of their device, by not harming, modifying or destroying any part of the laptop
- Bring their laptop daily, fully charged and ready to use
- Remember that the laptop is district property, and while using the laptop, Bark monitors all use. (If inappropriate material is flagged by Bark, administration is notified and families/students will be notified and possible disciplinary consequences will be given)

# **Visitors**

Adult community members and parents are invited to visit our school. We do not allow student visitors. All visitors must sign in and obtain a visitor's pass in the main office. Visitors who do not have a pass will be asked to go to the main office to get one. Phone messages to students should be limited to emergencies only.

### **Closed Campus**

For the protection and safety of our students, CGMS is a closed campus. Students should not be on campus before 7:55 A.M. Students arriving late to school must sign in at the front office. Guardians need to sign their student out in the office any time a student leaves the campus during school hours. Students may not leave campus after arrival without signing out in the front office.
