Art and Music

In art class, students are learning to draw historical buildings such as the Egyptian pyramids of Giza, Eiffel Tower, and Katskhi Pillar in Georgia. Starting with a letter, number, or simple shape, Mr. Pelissier teaches students step by step how to create these structures with perspective, texture and shading. In music class, Ms. Teti incorporates rhyming, letter sounds, and numbers in singing with Kindergarten students. Students



in grades 1-5 are learning note values. They use drums and keyboards to apply their note knowledge skills to play pieces of music. We thank you Ms. Teti and Mr. Pelissier for enriching our students' minds, developing their artistic skills, and building their background knowledge!

Cell Phone Policy

Students may bring a cell phone to school. The following is a summary of the District Student Handbook:

-Cell phones must be turned off during the school day and stored away so as not to distract from learning or lead to theft or damage.

-Cell phones in use during the school day are subject to being stored in the principal's office, and the parent asked to pick up the phone.

-Schools are not responsible for loss, damage, or theft of cell phones.

-Offensive photos or texts on phones may be subject to disciplinary action, even if they did not originate on campus.

-District policy JIH provides that school officials have the right to search a students' phone when there is reason to believe that the search will provide evidence of a law violation or school rule.

-Violation of cell phone rules may result in detention, suspension, or even expulsion.



TOA Talk: Bark Alerts

Our school district utilizes a free service called BARK, which monitors potential problems across G Suite, including YouTube, games, apps, etc., used while on their student accounts/devices. These potential safety concerns include online predators, adult content, cyberbullying, drug use, depression, suicidal thoughts, violence, and more. We know many times our students are simply trying to look up a video game or song they like on YouTube or other social media platforms. However, many have inappropriate content, whether it is violence, weapons, profanity, etc.

Have you signed up for BARK alerts? Earlier in the school year, you should have received an email from BARK inviting you to take advantage of the free opportunity to benefit from receiving real time alerts. If not, please utilize the link below that gives step-by-step instructions for setting up your account. As soon as you set up your account and opt in, you'll start receiving alerts when *BARK detects potentially timesensitive issues*.
