NURSE'S CORNER



Winter Nosebleeds

With the cold weather, dry skin and nosebleeds may become frequent. Nosebleeds are common and do not need to be treated by a doctor unless they are frequent, long in duration, heavy, or severe. If your child suffers from winter nosebleeds, use the following tips to prevent them:

- Keep the inside of your child's nose moist by using saline nose drops or petroleum jelly.
- Use a cold air humidifier in the child's room at night.
- Tell your child not to blow or rub their nose too hard and discourage nose picking.

During a nosebleed, the first step is to remain calm and remind your child to breathe through their mouth. Instruct your child to sit upright with their head tilted slightly forward (NOT tilted back) and to pinch the soft part of their nose with their thumb and index finger. A tissue, napkin, or wet washcloth can be used to catch the blood and an icepack may be applied to help slow the bleeding by constricting the blood vessels. If the nosebleeds are severe, frequent, or heavy, consult your pediatrician. Now, you should be ready to

conquer these winter nosebleeds!
