- Due to the tremendous responsibility the schools have to its students and the community, all individuals that wish to serve as guest speakers in the schools are required to report if they have been convicted of or admitted to a crime, even if the conviction was subsequently dismissed, set aside, deferred, vacated, or expunged. **By checking this box, I affirm that I am not awaiting trial, and that I have never been convicted of or admitted to any criminal offense.**

A conviction or pending trial will not necessarily prohibit one from serving as a guest speaker. However, individuals that wish to be considered for a volunteer position and who are awaiting trial or have been convicted of any offense, other than a minor traffic violation not involving drugs or alcohol, must describe the offense in detail on a separate page, including the year and location of the offense. The length of time since the conviction and the circumstances of the offense will be considered in reviewing a conviction record. Applications that have been intentionally falsified will be denied. Pursuant to A.R.S.13-3716, it is unlawful for a person who has been convicted of a dangerous crime against children as defined in section 13-604.01 or child abuse pursuant to section 13-3623, subsection A or subsection B, paragraph 1 to fail to give notice of the fact of the conviction to a school when volunteering for service.
